Here's the **A Major scale in all seven positions**. Remember, you can move this Major scale pattern anywhere on the fretboard. For example, in 1<sup>st</sup> position, if you start the scale on the 6<sup>th</sup> fret instead of the 5<sup>th</sup>, you'll be playing the B flat major scale. If you start on the 7<sup>th</sup> fret, you'll be playing the B major. Start on the 8<sup>th</sup> and you'll be in the key of C Major. Memorize the positions and you can play a solo in any key. Hope this helps you improve your playing!
